## ACADEMIC INFORMATION AND COURSE REGISTRATION\_\_\_

Before arriving at Deusto, students will be provided with course schedules. It is the students 'and Home University's responsibility to check there are no time conflicts in the courses students would like to attend.

We would like to inform you that courses have limited places. We therefore advise students to have a few back-up courses available as alternatives.

Once at the University of Deusto, students will have a period of approximately 6 days in order to decide the courses they would like to take and definitely register for the courses after that period. Before the day for Course Registration it is the Home Institution the one which should confirm the students that their course choice is appropriate.

Exchange students coming to the Business Degree can choose business subjects from our 1st., 2nd., 3rd. and 4th. year courses. Besides, students are allowed to take a maximum of 2 subjects from the Degree of Communication, Social Work or the Tourism Degree (except from languages from the Tourism Degree and the Business degree).

Spanish language courses are also on offer: there is an Intensive Spanish Course before the beginning of each semester and a Regular Spanish Course throughout the semester. An introductory course in Basque Language will be also on offer.

## HEALTH INSURANCE\_

#### **\*** Students with the European Health Card:

Apart from getting the European Health Card, students need to get a private insurance which covers the following:

- Death and repatriation.

#### **Students without the European Health Card:**

Students need to get a private insurance which covers the following:

- Medical treatment and hospitalization following illness or accident.
- Civil liability.
- Accidents and serious illness (including temporal and permanent disability).
- Death and repatriation.

The University of Deusto offers students the possibility to contract an insurance which covers all these aspects. It is not compulsory to contract this insurance if students have another one which meets the requirements mentioned above.
