Course 4 | Crises, Conflicts and Society

Migration, Media and the Masses.

In cooperation with the Center for Flight and Migration Eichstätt-Ingolstadt (100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German-Language Course (57 hrs) Language courses are offered at all levels.

Crises, Conflicts and Society (27 hrs)

In this course students will learn about current international crises and conflicts, the role of journalism and media coverage, and the effects they have on Germany and Europe. Special emphasis is on aspects of flight and migration.

The course is divided into three parts:

- current crises and conflicts
- the role of the media and journalism
- impacts on society

Experts will speak about the different issues. In addition, excursions and workshops will be integrated into the program.

Target group, language requirements

Students of social sciences, peace and conflict studies, and journalism, as well as professionals in these disciplines. This course is taught in English.

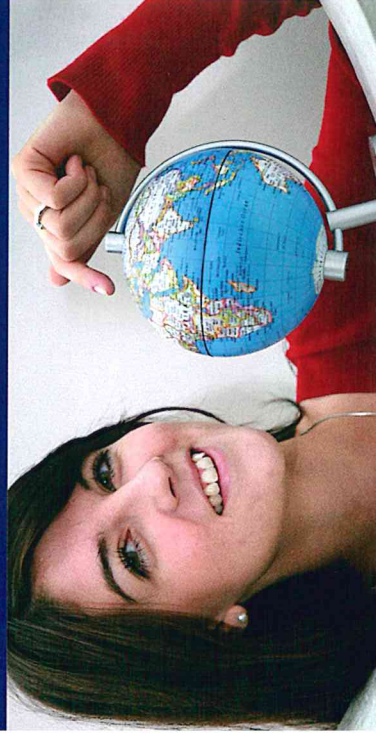
KU International Eichstätt Summer School July/August 2018

In addition to being an unforgettable experience, the KU International Eichstätt Summer School will earn you credit points according to the regulations of your home university. You will gain valuable insights into German and Bavarian cultural traditions and history, and also have the chance to visit iconic landmarks – in the past we have organized excursions to destinations such as the medieval town of Rothenburg ob der Tauber and the UNESCO World Heritage site Regensburg.

Course 1 | Study German in the Heart of Bavaria
(100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German-Language Course (77 hrs)

Basic to lower intermediate level, focused on current issues of German culture with project work.

Conversation and Cultural Studies (2 levels, 23 hrs)

Everyday dialogues, role play, town rally, project work, individual and team work.

Target group, language requirements

Students and professionals with an interest in German language and culture (basic and intermediate level).

Course 2 | Intensive German and Regional Culture

(100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German-Language Course (57 hrs)

Basic to lower intermediate level, focused on current issues of German culture with project work.

Conversation, Regional and Cultural Studies I (27 hrs)

Course exercises, interviews, presentations and role-playing covering everyday situations as well as regional and cultural specifics. Improving oral communication skills will be a priority of this course.

Conversation, Regional and Cultural Studies II (27 hrs)

This course will focus on regional and cultural topics and improve language capabilities through conversation, reading exercises and short essays and presentations.

Target group, language requirements

Students and professionals with an interest in German language and culture (basic and intermediate level).

Course 3 | Literature and Travel

(100 hrs, excursions included)

Intensive German-Language Course (57 hrs)

Basic to lower intermediate level, focused on current issues of German culture with project work.

Target group, language requirements

Students and professionals with an interest in and experience with German language and culture (intermediate and advanced level).



Literature and Travel (27 hrs)

“Where are we going, then?” This is the famous question raised in Novalis’ novel Heinrich von Ofterdingen, a key work of Romanticism, which is known for its depictions of travels and voyages, of wanderlust and desired destinations. Yet we know of writings even from ancient times that tell of people who are on a journey – to unknown places, to familiar destinations, to new shores and, above all, to their inner selves. This seminar is also a journey – a voyage through literary texts that tell of departure and abandonment, of wanderlust and homesickness, of unknown places and home.
