### Introduction

The **Catholic University of Eichstätt-Ingolstadt** (Katholische Universität Eichstätt-Ingolstadt, **KU**) is the **first and only Catholic university in the German-speaking world**. With around 5400 students, it is currently the smallest university in Bavaria. Being a small university, it provides an excellent environment for interdisciplinary exchange between the eight faculties and their subjects, made possible by almost 120 professors, over 300 research associates and a large number of lecturers with industry experience.

### Identity

The Catholic University of Eichstätt-Ingolstadt is a modern university with a long tradition. It has existed in its current form since 1980, but its roots go back to the year 1564 and the foundation of the Collegium Willibaldinum, the first priest seminary north of the Alps. The Ingolstadt School of Management was added in 1989. Ingolstadt also has a long tradition as a university town – Bavaria's first university was established there in 1472 with the Pope's approval.

The KU is a state-approved university that is supported by a Catholic foundation. The degrees and qualifications that the KU awards are equivalent to those issued by state universities in Germany. The KU welcomes students of all faiths and sees itself as an academic community that conveys knowledge and teaches social skills on the basis of Christian values. Open dialogue and critical thinking are key characteristics of the University's community and of the learning and teaching that take place here. The KU sees knowledge transfer as a third academic mission alongside research and teaching. Constructive discussion with society has an economic, cultural, social, political and Christian dimension at the KU.

It is sent by mail and/or e-mail directly to the student and the home university. Erasmus+ students automatically receive a copy by e-mail.</p>

After registering applicants will receive an e-mail containing their access code, enabling them to complete their data and download their Welcome Package. Afterwards they must upload the following documents:

- Print version of online application – signed by student and confirmed (signed and stamped) by home university
- Language proficiency form (if language of instruction is German: B1, if language of instruction is English: B2)
- Copy of passport (or ID)
- Passport photo
- Transcript of records
- Learning agreement / study program
- Housing application (highly recommended)
- Registration for pre-semester intensive German language course (recommended)

### Information about the learning agreement

The learning agreement is a contract between the exchange student, the KU and the home university. It has to be signed BEFORE starting the semester at the KU.

#### Courses in Eichstätt are mainly taught in German.

Classes and courses can be found on KU Campus, our online course catalog. In addition, students can find all courses taught in English on the KU International website. The finalized course catalog is usually confirmed **only a few weeks** before the semester starts (winter semester: early September; summer semester: early March).

If students need to finalize the learning agreement before, please use last year's courses initially. If anything needs to be changed, students can modify the learning agreement once they are in Eichstätt or Ingolstadt.

A comprehensive selection of courses regularly offered in English is currently only available in areas of business and economics at the **WFI – Ingolstadt School of Management**.

How to proceed with the learning agreement:

1. Students select the courses they would like to attend (from KU Campus & our website)
2. Students have their learning agreement approved (by signature) by their home university
3. Students send their document to the KU International Office (if not done by the home university)
4. The respective Erasmus+ departmental coordinator will check and – if approved – sign the learning agreement and return it to the International Office where we will sign and stamp it and send it back to the student (by e-mail)

How to change the learning agreement:

5. Students should discuss changes with their KU departmental coordinator and have them approved with a signature in their learning agreement

6. The International Office can confirm the approved changes and send the modified agreement to the home university. Please keep in mind the order of signatures, which is always 1. KU departmental coordinator, 2. KU International Office

Local transportation	Students do not need to take any local transportation if they are living in Eichstätt or in Ingolstadt. Both Eichstätt and Ingolstadt are small towns and especially in Eichstätt everything can be reached by foot. If students living in Eichstätt need to take courses in Ingolstadt, which is usually once or twice a week, they can take the bus shuttle. At the end of the semester 50% of the costs can be refunded. Cost per month for students: €107.80

Visa / entry requirements	
<b>No visa required</b> to enter and study in Germany  <b>BUT: Everybody who resides in Germany</b> (this applies to everyone regardless of nationality) <b>has to register at the local registration office</b>	Nationals of the <i>European Union</i> as well as citizens of <i>Iceland, Liechtenstein, Norway</i> and <i>Switzerland</i> do not need a visa.  However, <b>all students still need to register as a resident at their local registration office.</b>  <i>KU International Office Service in Eichstätt:</i> Students can register as residents in Eichstätt via the International Office. In addition to the completed forms, the International Office will need two copies of each student's personal ID card or passport.  <i>KU International Office Service in Ingolstadt:</i> Tutors are available to assist with the registration process.

<b>eAT required after arrival</b>  <b>AND</b>  <b>registration at the local registration office required</b>	<p>Nationals of <i>Australia, Israel, Japan, Canada, New Zealand, South Korea, United States, Andorra, Brazil, El Salvador, Honduras, Monaco</i> and <i>San Marino</i> have to request the eAT (electronic residence permit) after arrival AND having registered at their local registration office.</p> <p>The required documents for requesting the eAT are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ Passport (must be valid for the entire duration of stay in Germany)</li><li>▪ Certificate of enrolment from the KU</li><li>▪ Proof of financial resources or scholarship confirmation</li><li>▪ Health insurance confirmation (in German or English)</li><li>▪ Biometric passport photograph (we highly recommend having this photograph taken in Germany due to unique technical passport photograph specifications)</li><li>▪ Rental contract (all pages, and signed by the student and the landlord/landlady)</li><li>▪ Resident registration confirmation</li></ul> <p>A fee of approx. €100 is payable upon requesting the eAT. Scholarship holders (e.g. DAAD) may be exempt from paying this fee. For more information, please visit the German Foreign Office website.</p>
<b>Visa required prior to arrival</b> <b>AND</b> <b>eAT required after arrival</b> <b>AND</b> <b>registration at the local registration office required</b>	<p>Please visit the German Foreign Office website to find the most up-to-date information about requesting a visa. There, students can also check whether they need to apply for a visa or not.</p> <p>If the visa is not valid for the entire duration of the study period in Germany, students will have to extend their visa by requesting the eAT.</p> <p>For more information about the eAT, please see above.</p>
