#### Introduction

Definitions of tourism are varied, but in essence it includes "the activities of persons traveling to and staying in places outside their usual environment for not more than one consecutive year for leisure, business, and other purposes" (WTO, WTTC, Earth Council). Historically tourism has been seen as an environmentally benign alternative compared to other economic activities such as mining and agriculture that are, in turn, dependent on the use/exploitation and transformation of non-renewable

However, tourism has many negative impacts on natural and cultural environments such as excessive and inequitable resource use, destruction and fragmentation of habitat, social and cultural homogenization and commercialization, and, in some cases, economic exclusion. With the necessary precaution and mitigation measures in place, tourism can have numerous positive impacts as well.

This course focuses on the various impacts (at different geographical scales), of tourism on primarily natural environments (as shaped by the variations in the earth's realms and environmental conditions). Ways of measuring and assessing environmental impacts of tourism as well as devising ways to minimize/mitigate such impacts will also receive attention. A strong focus will therefore be placed on Tourism and Environmental Management (IEM).
